Paul speaks about his frequent times of hardship and of going without. This letter to the people in Philippi was written when he was in prison. What did he have to rejoice about? Paul was consumed with the wonder of God. He had a remarkable ability to look beyond his own personal circumstances and see the wonder of his God whom he knew loved him through and through. How can we catch this? As you begin to pray, take your eyes off your own circumstances for a while and seek to catch the eternal truths that the Bible reveals to us. Father God calls us his children; so great is his love for us that he gave us his own Son; Jesus revealed to us what God is really like; he was so passionate about us that he died in order that he might carry the punishment for all we have done wrong; the Holy Spirit loves us enough to want to be so close to us that he lives in us. Ponder these truths – there must be something here that causes you to rejoice at the wonder of God.

Food Donations required for Worthing Soup Kitchen (WSK) Food Parcels and Pantry

Crate for Donations can be found in the Church entrance – a huge thank you to those who have already given donations. The Charity is delighted that we are supporting them and say a huge thank you to our congregation. I have just received an update from the Charity that the Soup Kitchen is very much in demand as people who are found rooms for the night have no cooking facilities and food parcels are still very much in demand.

We thought that readers of the Fellowship News might like to know some of the services that Worthing Soup Kitchen offer:

Homeless People – WSK are partners with Turning Tides and on a Sunday homeless people can go to St Clare's Day Centre to have a shower etc and a hot cooked breakfast.

Soup kitchen is open in the evenings and for those vulnerable homeless people unable to travel hot food is delivered to them.

Temporary Accommodation – those going into temporary accommodation might need furniture, bedding etc and WSK will help find people who are able to help. Food parcels are also delivered.

Outreach Work – hot meals are delivered to families and there is also a midweek warm up session where meals, a chat, plus help and advice is available.

Café Hub – is open seven days a week and profits are used for the other services. The Café is also used as part of their outreach work.

Updating skills - those people trying to get back into employment can go to the rear of the café hub where there is a room with IT where people can receive help on completing job applications, CVs and take courses to increase their IT skills. Other courses are also available on more general skills.

Community Fridge is open every Friday for those in need.

Food parcels and pantry

Future plans – include a shop to help raise further funds for the above services. The Charity has also been donated a local allotment to grow their own food.
