





Road to Emmaus Cleopas

Treetings Samuel,

When we last met together, we were this cussing the fact that I was a follower of the Rabbi Jesus, and you were anticipating a crisis. Well, you no doubt heard that the crisis ended with the trial and crucifixion of our dear Jesus, which devastated us all.

My dear friend, something amazing happened to me after that which you may not have heard about. We had left the believers in Jerusalem and were returning to Emmaus, broken-hearted, totally disillusioned, and disappointed.



told him how we were expecting Jesus to rescue the nation of Israel from its Roman rulers and that after he had been killed his body had disappeared from the tomb, despite being closely guarded. Some women said that they had seen him since, but we didn't believe them.

This stranger then started to explain the Scriptures from Moses and the Prophets, which had foretold all this. We were so riveted that when we reached our village we asked him to stay over.

While we were eating he broke the bread and suddenly we recognised who he was - our Jesus! We had been so absorbed in our own grief and disappointment, we couldn't see beyond

our noses. We knew that he was explaining the Scriptures, but now it all fell into place - he was the promised Messiah and it was we who had misunderstood his purpose.

Suddenly, Jesus disappeared and we looked at one another with our mouths open, a look of joyful amazement on our faces. I don't know what the time was, but we jumped up and made our way back to Jerusalem where we found the other disciples and told them our story.

Oh Sam, you may not believe this bit but, here goes; Jesus actually appeared in the room among us and, as we were all in a state of shock, he showed us his hands and feet where he had been nailed to the cross and invited us to touch him!!! He then ate a piece of fish - just to prove a point!

As you may imagine, all this changed us from being downcast and disillusioned to becoming faith-filled and 'on-fire'. But, d'you know Sam, I'm sure this is the just the beginning of something HUGE and exciting, so please do come and join me so that you can be part of it. I know you won't regret it.

The ordeal is over; the scars remain

"Unless I see the nail marks in His hands and put my finger where nails were, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe it." (John 20: 25)

How patient Jesus was, in giving 'Doubting Thomas' a second chance! Earlier, the risen Christ had said to His disciples, "Peace be with you!" (Verse 19). And it is only because of those scarred hands that His peace is made available.

There have been many religious leaders in history – but only one had scars as the proof of what He had achieved. It is also evident that - after Christ's bodily resurrection - the scars were never obliterated. "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe" (verse 27).

The ordeal was over – but the scars remain – for ever. At the end of time - in the future New Creation – our Lord Jesus Christ will still have those scars, when He is affirmed as 'the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world' (Revelation 3:8). The apostle Peter himself echoed the timelessness of the Cross of Calvary (1 Peter 1:20). The Cross and Resurrection form the centrepiece of our entire human story.

The scarred hands... It is vital that one and all should receive the lesson that Thomas learned that day: "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed" (verse 29)

For it would not be long before the bodily presence of the Lord would be removed from human sight. From then on, it would be the preaching of the apostolic witnesses that would take Christ's message to the ends of the world. Thomas himself was going to be despatched to India! Later would see Augustine to Canterbury, Francis sent to Assisi, Patrick to Ireland and Livingstone to Africa.

Today sees the mission of the risen Jesus criss-crossing all over the world – creating the biggest and fastest-growing body of belief ever known.

Be a living exponent of this Easter Gospel yourself. Use it, proclaim it, know it and live it. Then you can identify along with believing Thomas!

Prayer Pointers:

- Pray for the Holy Spirit to fill the Church with His presence and guidance;

Thank you very much for your food donations - it really does make a difference to how much the WSK are able to help those more vulnerable in our community.


The following items would be appreciated:
