

Welcome from Reverend Robin Brenchley

What a wonderful picture adorns the front page of this edition of our newsletter, a reminder, if we needed it, that it is the Holy Spirit who trains us and moulds us so that we become ever more like our Lord Jesus.

One of the things that first attracted us to this church was the love that we were shown when we visited, and the evident love that the church had for each other. We have been reminded of this again over the past two months as we have dealt with two family losses: and yet, in the midst of it all we have been very much aware of being upheld in love.

There is nothing more attractive than a church that is operating in the fruit of the Spirit, especially in God's love. Sadly the oposite is also true, because - and we must be clear about this - if we aren't operating in love, then we are worse than useless to God. Paul himself said "If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal." [1 Corinthians 13:1] and the same is just as true of us.

God wants nothing more than to have us partner with him in His mission to save men and women who would otherwise perish, but he cannot use us if we aren't operating in the fruit of the Spirit, because we might do harm rather than help.

So, if there is someone in the church, or nearby that you find it difficult to love, perhaps because you disagree with them about something, make all the more effort to love them. None of us want to be useless, or worse yet, put God in the position of having to remove us from the ministry we love to stop us causing harm.

Because, it will be no good us telling God what they did to hurt us, or how wrong they were. He expects us to forgive just as completely as Jesus did from the cross, and will hold us accountable for failing to to do so.

No, He doesn't reject us and this won't change where we are going, but it may steal some of our joy on the journey.




