- We pray that all of the seeds sown to everyone who walked through the Church doors during Holiday Club, and those seeds watered by the Holy Spirit.


Help:

Highlights of Holiday Club week by the Groups - amalgamated as appropriate.

Day one and throughout the week it was lovely to see so many children come who live out of the area and who we only usually see when they are staying with grandparents etc. Out of 28 children registered, I counted ten of them, plus two who we have not seen for a few months due to illness in the family. So we had 12 children who otherwise we would not see in our Church.

Groups

All but one group had children that needed encouragement and reassurance to try new things. It was lovely to see the children grow in confidence throughout the week - those whose voices were barely a whisper on day one had found their "big voices" [Lizzy's term] by the end of the week.

For example - the five-year-olds had a little boy who just stood and watched on day one but by the end of the week he was up singing and doing the actions and fully joining in with everything.

The exception was Lorraine's older group – she had the same children as when they were aged 9 – now 10 and some 11s and the difference she said was how much noisier they were this time round!

Lorraine's was very pleased at how well the group gelled together especially as they came from different schools. It was also lovely to see them using Bibles to do the group work.

Lizzy and Marion put together Holiday Club songs and the children loved their time of worship. One little girl stood with her teddy teaching him the actions which was lovely to watch.

The fabulous Newtons

Now looking at my group - I had the fabulous 7s — also known as Newtons - we averaged four children a day. Two did not live locally so we set up a buddy system and it was lovely to see them every morning as they went round the Church in a little group looking for those vital missing test tubes [Teddie's lost object] and obtaining the points from Robin.

Activity Book - Solomon

Looking at the activity book that they all had, **Day one** was the story of Solomon asking God to be wise - the children observed that in today's world a lot of people think that they are smarter than they are and they were surprised that Solomon was not one of those. This story stayed with them the whole week and they were still talking about it on the last day.

Later that morning one little girl sat in the craft area and made the little King Solomon all by herself. The helper redundant by her side. She was determined not to have help.

B. Always good to have an expert on the planets in my group. He excelled at the set exercises – gently leading the others.

Day three started off a little disappointing as none of the children in my group knew the significance of a rainbow. All agreed that it made them feel happy and two little girls had dressed up in rainbow outfits. Things improved when we discussed Jesus being the Light of the World. They explained that at Ferring School at the beginning of the assembly a candle is lit, and they knew that was because Jesus is the Light. At the end of Assembly the Headmaster says – May the Lord be with you and the children answer with "and with you". Lovely way to start the day.

One of the highlights of the week was on the playing field, the boys loved having a session with the **Ferring Football coaches** and they were so good with one little boy that needed extra encouragement. Meanwhile the girls loved doing their gymnastics with Julie.

Day four started well with two little girls who I call the tumbling tots – in they came all happy as they have not been able to come for a while. Delighted that they have known the Church for a year now.

However, day four was tricky – we were given this complicated exercise of pictures, numbers 1 to 7, slips of paper with words on and despite looking in the bible and on phones we found it hard to match the days of creation with what we had been given. It was time critical and that added to our stress levels. Not down for long though we were soon out on the field with bowls of water running up and down with lots of laughter. The Days of Creation exercise will be repeated in Youth Group, without the pressure of time.

Lizzy noted the differences in how girls and boys work. The girls in my group planned their colouring and once we had discussed rainbows - the same colours were lined up for other pictures. The boys though, preferred having spent time building their creatures in the craft room, as soon as back in the group wanted to take them apart and make them again.

Overall, the children were a delight and it was a privilege to have them. They learnt that God loves them very much and about the amazing and wonderful creation that he made especially them. The children got on well, shared resources and looked out for each other

As the children left on the last day they were making plans about coming next year and that was wonderful to hear.

One of our prayer warriors said now we have to pray that the seeds sown are watered by the Holy Spirit and grow. Amen to that.
